DOTTY OTLEY makes a welcome return to the stage after playing Mrs Hackett, Britain's most famous lollipop lady.) ('Ooh, I can't, arldy, old me lolly up!') in over 20 episodes on TV's *On The Zebras*.

BELINDA BLAIR has been on stage since the age of four when she was in Miss Toni Tanner's Ten Tapping Tots. Most recently she has been seen in comedy hits such as *Don't Mr Diddle!* and *Twice Two is Sex*.

GARRY LEJEUNE while at drama school won the coveted Laetitia Daintyman Medal for Violence. His TV work includes *Police!*, *Crime Squad!*, and *The Nick!* but he is best known as Cornetto, the ice-cream man who stirs the hearts of the lollipop ladies in *On The Zebras*.

SELSDON MOWBRAY first 'trud the boards' at the age of 12 as Lucius in *Julius Caesar*, with his father, the great Chelmsford Mowbray playing the lead. His most recent film appearance was as Outraged Pensioner in *Green Willies*.

BROOKE ASHTON is probably best known as the girl wearing nothing but 'good, honest, natural froth' in the Hauptbahnhofbrau lager commercial. Cinemagoers saw her in *The Girl in Room 14*, where she played the girl in Room 312.

FREDERICK FELLOWES has appeared in many popular TV series, including *Calling Casualty*, *Cardiac Arrest!*, *Out-Patients*, and *In-Patients*.

ROBIN HOUSEMONGER (author) turned his experience as an unsuccessful gents hosiery wholesaler into his first play *Socks before Marriage* which ran for nine years. Two of his subsequent plays, *Briefs Encounters* and *Hanky Panky*, broke box office records in Perth, Australia. *Nothing On* is his seventeenth play.

LLOYD DALLAS (director) read English at Cambridge and stagecraft at the local benefits office'. In 1999 he won the South of Scotland Critics' Circle Special Award. In 2002 he directed a highly successful season for the National Theatre in Sri Lanka.

TIM ALLGOOD (stage manager) graduated with a certificate of distinction in Backstage Kinetics from the Ballinacurra Institute of Technology in Limerick, Ireland. He has worked on many shows including *Half-way House* and *Banjaxed*.

POPPY-NORTON TAYLOR (stage asst.) always wanted to be in theatre. She worked 'productively' with the director in his apartment on some early sketches of the set.
